Bengaluru City University formerly known as Bengaluru Central University came into existence from the year 2017-18 following the trifurcation of Bangalore University with the twin objectives of administrative reforms and quality enhancement.

Given the unique strategic location of the University on the Central College Campus in the heart of the city, the University was renamed as “Bengaluru City University” with effect from 19th June 2020. The University Grants Commission (UGC) has recognized the new University under section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956. Guidelines for Abstract Submission

Participants are invited to submit original abstracts related to the conference theme. The abstract should not exceed 250- 300 words, written in Times New Roman, 12-point font, with 1.5 line spacing. It must include the title, author(s) name, affiliation, email ID and 4–6 keywords. A brief author bio (50–70 words) should also be included in the same document. Abstracts must be submitted in MS Word (.docx) format to mlaconference2025@gmail.com by 31st July 2025. All submissions will be peer-reviewed and selected abstracts will be published in the conference proceedings.

Guidelines for Full-Length Paper Submission

The papers submitted must be original and unpublished. All submitted papers shall be subjected to peer review and plagiarism check. The research paper should be submitted in the format given below:

- Each paper can have a maximum of 4 Authors
- All authors are required to register individually
- Authors can register for oral or poster presentation
- Each research paper must contain an abstract with 4-6 keywords
- Length of full paper – Paper should comprise not more than 3,000 to 4,000 words in single column in MS Word (.docx) format
- Typed in MS-Word using Times New Roman 12 font, 1.5-line spacing and margins of one inch on all sides
- The manuscript should be formatted according to the journal requirement (will be notified after the acceptance of full length paper)
